Our Ivy Beyond The Wall, (2019) Soror Ruth C. Easley did not only serve as the 25th North Atlantic Regional Director of The Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Incorporated from 1982-1986, but was active in many other facets of her beloved sorority and community organizations. Soror Ruth was a "Life Member" and an active "Golden Soror" of the Omega Omega Chapter in Philadelphia, PA. At the international level of the sorority, she served on the Program, Standards, Directorate Training and Leadership Development Task Force Committees.

She was a retired educator with 35 years of experience as a classroom teacher, tele-teacher, homebound investigator, guidance counselor and public relations consultant. She received a Bachelor of Science degree from Bennett College, a Master of Arts degree in Guidance/Personnel Services from New York University and a post-graduate certification from Pennsylvania State University.

Soror Ruth was known locally, statewide and nationally for her community involvements. Her numerous affiliations included Top Ladies of Distinction, National Adoption Center, Ladies of Alpha, Girl Scouts of America, Frontiers International Auxiliary, Afro-American Museum, Tribune Charities, American Association of Retired Persons and Life Member of NAACP.

In 1976, 21 members of Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Inc. realized the need for a graduate chapter of Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Inc. to serve in the Dekalb County area. As a result, the Lambda Epsilon Omega Chapter received its charter in June 1976. Like our founders in 1908, the Lambda Epsilon Omega Chapter has continued to serve the community in many


